	There is a plan to alleviate flooding in Holly Avenue as per Lillian Greenwood, but it seems to be getting worse. BH asked this meeting be advertised which was done.	
	SA – Flooding is bad around Bader and Main Road where bungalows are	
	JT – Aaron Close and allotments at the back. When water level at highest there was no water on allotment but when cleared from Wilford Lane the Allotments flooded	
	TSp – On Maplestead Avenue sewage was in our property. Oct 2020 – Severn Trent cleaned up then haven't since due to them stating this is an "act of God". Severn Trent state they don't have maps of sewer system	
	HS – Thanked for allowing her here today. Council has 2 sections to run the city – office for day to day and the other is the councillors who are elected. 55 councillors, 8 have a portfolio who report into office and portfolio holders. CJ and AC – flooding comes under both of their areas.	
	There is a meeting due between Severn Trent (ST), Environment Agency (EA), Notts County Council (NsCC) and Nottingham City Council (NCC). Where they can take the concerns to, therefore don't have any extra news but can take points from this meeting to it.
